

CASE STUDY: SOCIAL VALUE – KELP ENVIRONMENTAL LABOUR APPRENTICES

To date for one of our major infrastructure clients we have given opportunities to over twelve apprentices. Two of our apprentices came through our relationship with KELP (Kotuku Environmental Labourer project). This was a Lottery funded Social Enterprise scheme which provided out of work local young people with environmental skills and experience so they could undertake environmental duties (such as completing waste transfer notes and understanding hazardous waste). The scheme was very successful and both apprentices are still working for Taylor Woodrow. For example, Jonathan Tucker was on Job Seeker's allowance prior to starting as an apprentice in 2014 through the KELP programme. Jonathan has since helped the project he is working on to win various sustainability awards. Jonathan recently passed his AIEMA (Associate IEMA exam) and was recently promoted to Environmental Advisor. We are supporting Jon through a part time Environmental Degree at Birkbeck University.
