- The Construction industry has been challenged by Government to make a step change in productivity. The Farmer report “Modernise or die” sets out the shortcomings of the sector as has the Egan and Latham reports before it. The imperative to change is compelling.
- The tragic case of the Grenfell disaster and the resulting report from Dame Judith Hackett sets out the case for improved skills in all areas but procurement is pivotal to ensuring such a tragedy is not repeated.

- Between May 2021 and March 2023, we will use these resources and offer free consultancy services to 10 partners are looking to improve procurement and evidence better productivity and value.

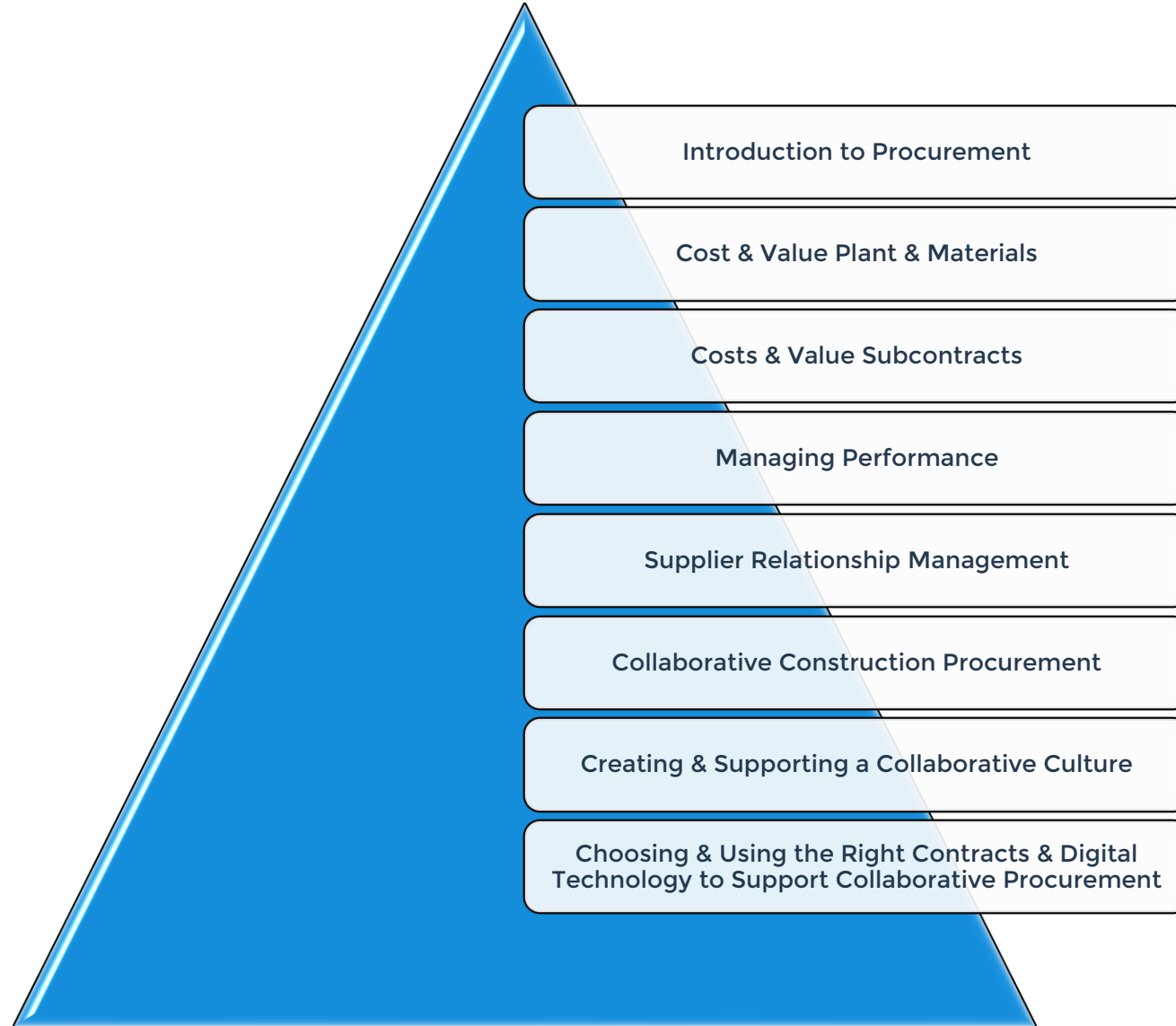

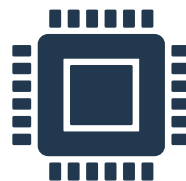
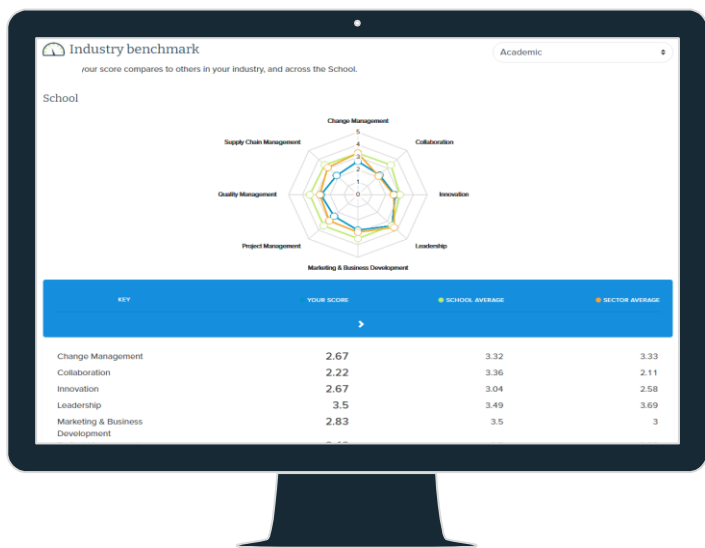
Projects/organisations or who are successful in becoming Supply Chain Improvement Programs will benefit from:

This is a typical example. Each programme will have a bespoke plan.



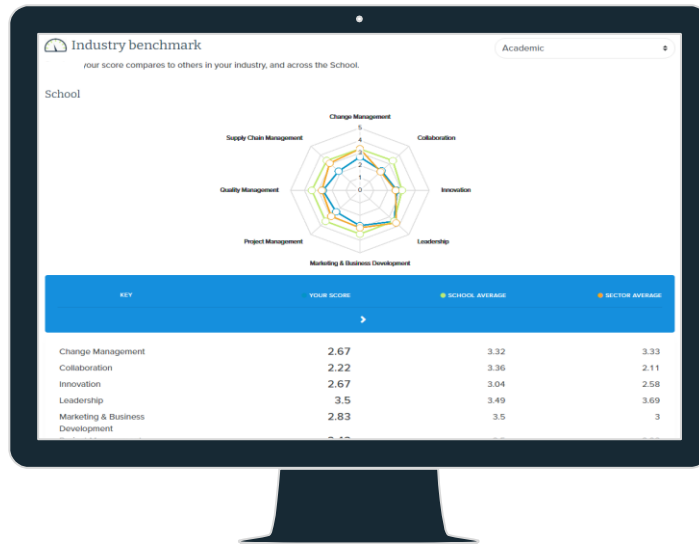

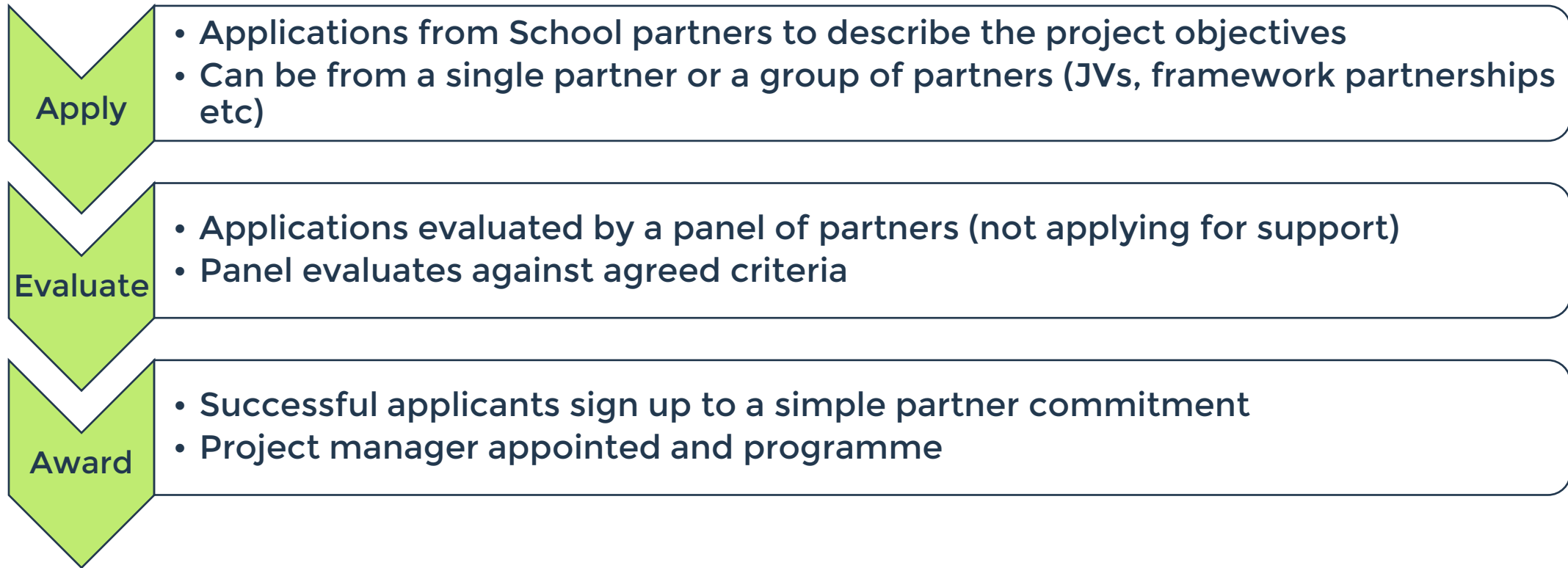
After completing the assessment, you and your colleagues will receive a gap analysis and a tailored learning action plan linking you to the Supply Chain School's comprehensive learning library.

Our programme will provide you with a cloud-based tool with which you can measure the performance of all the participants in your project close to real time to enable you to identify problems early and recognise the success of your performance improvement objectives.

The tool enables regular reporting of metrics and indicators related to environment, productivity, safety, quality and financial performance and enables effective management through RAG dashboards and smart graphs.



- Your organisation must be a partner in the Supply Chain School and commit to remaining a partner for the duration of the programme
- You may apply as a single partner or a group of partners operating as a JV or other collaborative arrangement such as a framework
- The programme must be able to demonstrate tangible benefits before March 2023
- The programme can apply to a project, a work package within a large project or a range of projects delivered through a framework
- Your application must be supported by a senior executive who is committed to participate in periodic reviews and to actively oversee the project
- Nominated members of your team must commit to participating in the recommended learning pathway
- You must commit to using the cloud based performance tool to monitor and manage project performance outcomes
- You must commit to contributing to a case study to describe the outcomes and challenges related to your project
