5	 Plastic Packaging tax latest guidance HMRC have been running some very useful webinars which are advertised here: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/help-and-support-for-agents#plastic-packaging-tax - you can also view the recordings of these at the same link. It feels as though a significant part of the management of this issue, both internally and through the supply chain, is likely to fall on procurement and sustainability teams David from Michelmersh discussed learnings from recent webinar – they have to make sure their suppliers are meeting the requirements of the tax and will also have to provide evidence they themselves haven't reached the threshold. In this sense there are potentially significant admin requirements whether paying tax or not. Builder's merchants are asking questions to suppliers. They are hearing from plastic packaging suppliers that: they are not able to source enough recycled plastic to offer more sustainable solutions they are in many cases unclear as the proportion of recycled content in existing packaging.
