Challenges:

Woodlands Site Services have always embraced sustainable technologies and mindfully approached the impact of construction projects in the comm unities where they have been involved. This has been achieved by aligning their values with their Tier 1 contractors including achieving sustainable goals and through innovative planning, collaboration, and a willingness to invest in the most sustainable technologies available.

Impact / Case Study:



Severe budget constraints on a project were seen as a barrier to achieving sustainable goals due to the high cost of limited energy efficient options available, Woodlands were able to demonstrate that through proper design the savings in energy would offset any perceived capital expenditure. The innovative Woodlands design team along with a coll aborative approach with El Bjorn and the client not only came up with a low wattage LED lighting solution but also implemented an extra low voltage energy supply, saving over 180,000 watts of energy which was presented as a Net cost saving.

Value gained:

The benefits that the learnings from the Supply Chain Sustainability School have bought Woodlands are significant though and mainly twofold.

Firstly, as a business, though the company assessments we have been able to clearly see our strengths and weaknesses and have begun to implement formal strategies to not only work on the gaps but strengthen and formalise our approaches to the areas where we are already strong and can make a significant contribution or measurable impact.

Secondly, as a supplier through gaining a better understanding of how best to communicate our strengths from the schools elearning modules in a measurable way, we can clearly demonstrate to our clients at tender stage how our sustainable designs and investment can benefit a project in real terms (TC02, KwH, Recycled Water, Carbon Tax etc) giving us a competitive edge on major projects where sustainability is a need and not just a want.
