<u>Modern Slavery Due Diligence Checklist</u> (Intermediate) This checklist is based on best practice in the construction sector. It outlines what organisations should have in place to combat modern slavery, as well as helping procurement specialists understand how to evaluate supply chain responses to requests for their own due diligence processes.

<u>Supply Chain Mapping Protocol</u> (Intermediate) This protocol is designed to help you understand what supply chain mapping (SCM) is, why we should be doing it, what the benefits are of doing it, and how to go about it. It is aimed at organisations who have real intent on discovering who is in their supply chain, but also want to use that information to avoid and mitigate sustainability risks as well as uncover opportunities.

Setting Up Your Site to Combat Modern Slavery (Intermediate) With estimates of 136,000 slaves in the UK, and construction ranking third in the list of industries reporting forced labour in the UK (as reported by the Gangmaster and Labour Abuse Authority), you cannot stand on any site in the UK and claim that there is no slavery in your supply chain.

<u>Your Project - Modern Slavery in Construction</u> (*Intermediate*) A video illustrating the nature of supply chains found in the construction industry and where opportunities for slavery can be found.

Operation Fort: What Businesses Should Learn From The UK's Largest Anti-Slavery Prosecution (Advanced) Operation Fort is similar to many other modern slavery cases in encompassing many different types of crime, including modern slavery, human trafficking, fraud, deception, theft and physical abuse. All parties, including law enforcement, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), banks, retailers, suppliers and labour providers can learn from this difficult experience. The focus of this review is the questions that it raises for business.

<u>ILO Combating Forced Labour: A Handbook for Employers and Business</u> (Expert) In a series of seven booklets, the handbook provides guidance on preventive and remedial action, reviews good practice in combating forced labour, and presents information relevant to senior business managers, human resource personnel, sourcing and social compliance staff, social auditors and others.
