Performance Update

As part of the School's ambitious target of 50,000 active individuals by 2025, it has set targets for 22,000 active individuals for 2022/23 and 35,000 for 2023/24. The School is also growing its' Partner Relations and Delivery Teams in order to account for this projected growth.

After deciding on a business plan for the School's Offsite programme last meeting, we have set more ambitious targets for learners accessing offsite materials and attending training.

In particular, we have already exceeded our target for active companies accessing Offsite learning in Q1, achieving 564 versus the 450 target. In terms of active individuals and planning in sessions for this financial year, we are making progress but are currently short of the targets, with plans to make up numbers in Q2.

Training feedback and upcoming sessions

David mentions some of the upcoming webinars on the benefits of offsite in reducing carbon:

The group discussed the possibility of delving into the more technical and detailed side of sustainability in offsite. Partners expressed concerns that detail can be lost in the School's sessions exploring the broader topics in sustainability.

David gave an overview of upcoming events surrounding specific materials used in offsite construction which should mitigate this problem. They include:

- <u>Can we build Passivhaus in Steel?</u> 22nd June, 12:00pm-13:00pm
- Achieving zero carbon in buildings with the use of timber.
- Exploring offsite in infrastructure projects. In particular, how can offsite help in the sustainability challenges facing infrastructure projects.
- <u>Navigating the carbon impact in offsite construction</u>, delivered with the French Offsite School, Campus Hors-Site – 27th June, 11:30am-12:30pm

Impact Survey

Naomi Pratt showed the partners on the call the results of the recent Impact Survey for Offsite. There are 1,238 (1,183 last year) active Offsite members of the School and 4,855 (4,356 last year) active individuals with an interest in Offsite. 63 out of 1,064 members who responded to the Impact Survey stated that they are active in the Offsite topic area.

Out of all the 63 organisations, the primary business functions were split as follows:

- 16 in Assembly
- 11 in Design
- 26 in Manufacturing
- 9 in Logistics

Below are the results for the question, 'Since joining the School, has your organisation improved your...':

- Design 83% (up from 75% last year)
- Manufacturing 84% (up from 63% last year)
- Logistics 71% (up from 66% last year)
- Assembly 71% (up from 63% last year)

Furthermore, below are the % of respondents agreeing that the School has improved processes in:

- Design 66%
- Manufacturing 61%
- Logistics 53%
- Assembly 52%

84% of organisations said that engaging in the School has helped their understanding of Clients Offsite Objectives, and 76% indicated that engaging with the School has improved the quality of their bids.

The partners on the call offered an idea to follow up with those companies stating that the School has been improving their processes, finding out what these improvements are, and showcasing



them in a case study-based webinar. Additionally, the impact survey could be advertised to companies to attract them to the School and to the School's events.

Action:

School team to look into the Impact Survey data in more detail to pull out the specific companies and company types responding, and use this information to guide case study development and showcases in training sessions.

Company Assessment

The School has been in the process of bringing together a new maturity assessment for offsite. Those completing it will be provided with an action plan based on their answers.

The new assessment will have questions which ask what your organisation is actively doing in an area, e.g. leadership, as opposed to the last assessment which asks organisations to evaluate their knowledge in an area.

After submitting evidence to show their organisation's progress in an area, partners will be provided with an action plan, along with learning resources to look at. There will then be a second step and another action to follow. The following steps will include creating a strategy, and then embedding the strategy in their organisation.

We will keep partners informed when the maturity assessment is completed and ready to be accessed. Our estimate for the completion period is the end of July.

New School Groups

Retrofit Group

The School's new Retrofit Group has been launched. The first Retrofit Group meeting took place on 24th May 2023.

The School is creating an assessment for individuals working in retrofit which will assess their knowledge of the industry. Additionally, there will be an assessment on a business's capacity to deliver retrofit which will be circulated across all members of the School. This can benefit Wales partners as they will be able to assess individuals in their organisation and their supply chain.

Future Workforce Group

The School is also creating a new Future Workforce Group which will bring together education providers so that we can upskill teachers and students, providing them with knowledge in sustainability. As a result, individuals will enter the workforce equipped with the knowledge they need in sustainability to have a real impact.



This will be beneficial for our partners as it will help them with their workforce planning, enabling them to influence the skills environment, getting connections into education institutions and embedding long-lasting social value.
