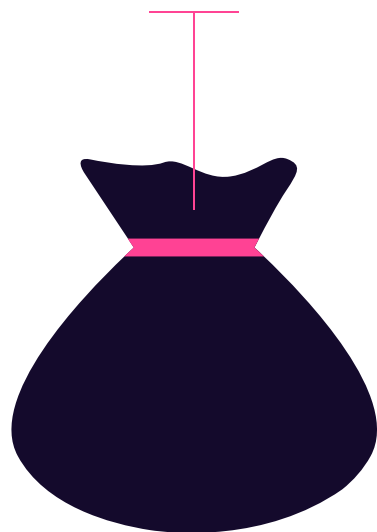

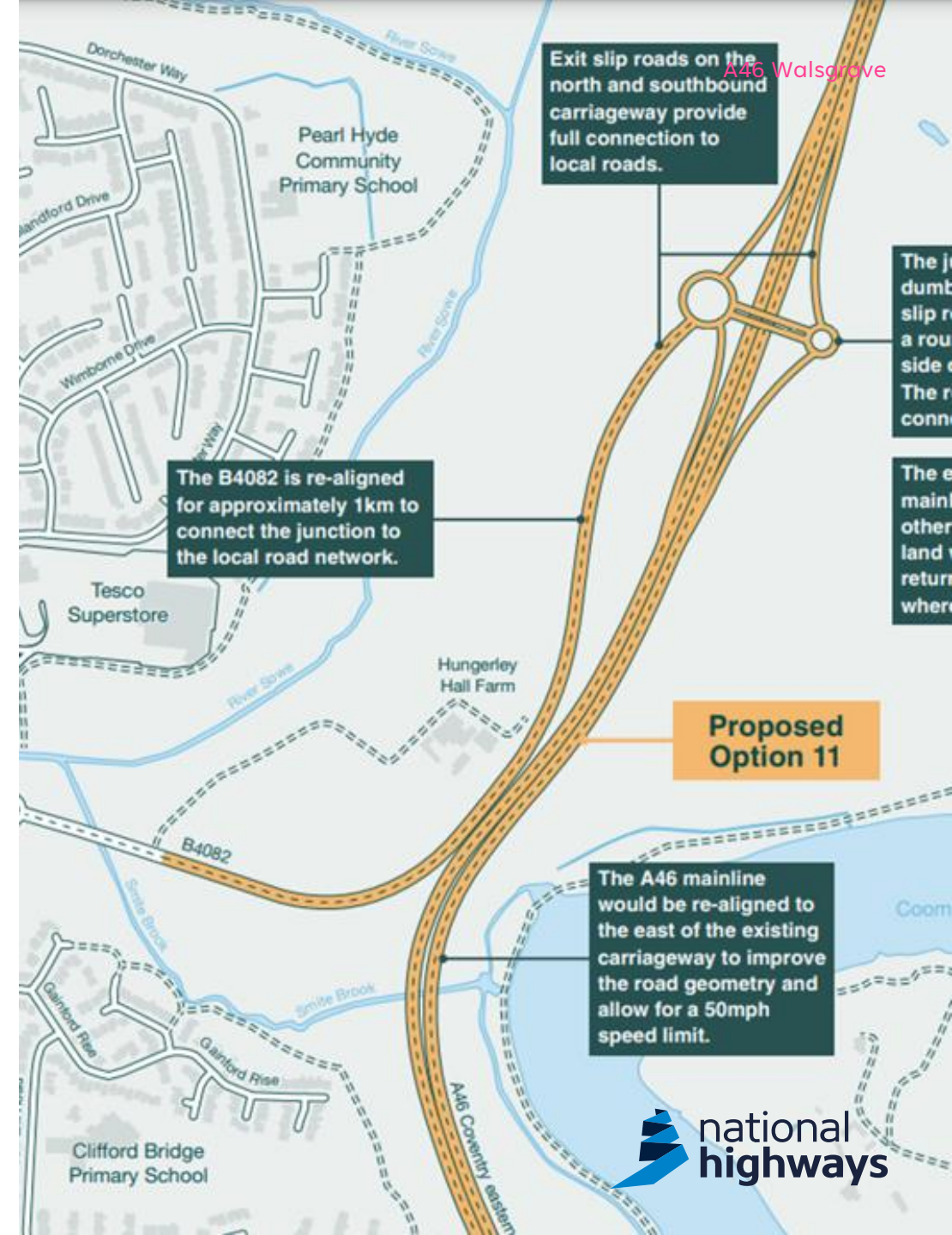


Project Overview

Scheme Budget: £111M

Construction Budget: £72M (subject to change)

Scope of the project: Grade separation dumbbell junction 800m to the north of the existing junction along the existing mainline alignment and an extension of the existing B4082.























































































































































































































































































Scheme Objectives
