1. Welcome and introductions.

The chair, Ben Stone, introduced the group and the agenda.

3. HVO Fuel Update

Ben Stone talked about the division surrounding HVO and what Kier is doing with regards to this area, stating that they are not going to expand their use until they are more comfortable with the level of assurance from the supply chain. There are many risks around this area, including prosecutions for those fraudulently claiming virgin palm oil was used cooking oil, cutting down rain forests, and forced labour risks.

They are currently working with a group of clients, peers, and manufacturers who have contributed £4,000 each to Action Sustainability for a project that will look into what checks should be done to get comfortable using HVO. By the end of the year there should be some guidance on sourcing HVO and being more confident of its sustainability. Will also be looking at how they account for carbon-consistency in how to report across the sector.

5. Waste Group Deep Dive

Matt Nichols, Chair of the Waste Group talked about the Waste Group, their priorities, how they run their meetings and their deliverables for the future.

- Leadership Group Meetings

- The group meets quarterly, with 30-35 participants, and mostly work in break out groups. In these groups, they will identify a project that they would like to work on, and bring this to the main group. Everyone will then hear about this project and those with a particular interest with create a sub-group to work on this. They use menti polls etc. to vote on their priorities for the upcoming year.
- The aim of the waste group is around achieving and doing things, which has been their focus for the last few years.
- They use a slide to bring new members or external parties up to speed. It shows how each part of the supply chain is impacted by waste, highlighting their sustainability responsibilities.

- Resources

- One of the group's priorities is the creation of resources, for example, the Construction Project Life Cycle of Waste. It included case studies, examples, and opportunities for improvement. This was created by a Waste sub-group.
- They have been updating and maintaining the resources on the school's website to make sure these are as relevant as possible, including case studies, the MEP map, and more.
