1. Welcome and introductions.

2. Updates on School Activity

Biodiversity

- The School has recognised the needs of industry to address biodiversity and is launching a Biodiversity group.

Context:

- Biodiversity is what stakeholders talk about most outside of carbon and climate change.
- With biodiversity net gain legislation, there are huge potential costs to deal with a 10% biodiversity net gain.
- Interesting studies have shown that brownfield left for some time has more biodiversity than greenfield on agricultural land so there is a need to consider how the built environment manages the

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- ecosystem but still provides the infrastructure, housing, or other construction projects.
- Businesses will need to disclose TNFD in the coming years, so will need to manage baseline nature impacts and disclose how materials are managed.




The group then voted on a number of Menti questions to see where the group was at against the objectives set out in the business plan:



Is your organisation represented on the Social Value group?




Is your organisation represented on the Climate Action group?






Is your organisation represented on the Waste group?




Has your organisation uploaded a recent priority suppliers list?






Has your organisation done any recent engagement of internal colleagues to learn on the school?


Being new, it would be great to know more about the pathway but also need to look at specifics for offshore construction.

Carbon tunnel vision




The group jamboards and notes are below.

Group 1:


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- The focus on net zero is shifting away to other things like water and biodiversity. Need to
 provide direction on what the focus is for climate action to make sure it doesn't lose sight of
 carbon.
- Need to embed net zero targets into procurement.
- Need to understand embodied carbon in more materials and products (EPD's)
- Lots of issues around gathering, and interpreting data. This still isn't standardised in the industry.
- Need to tackle carbon as contributes so much to the other climate impacts.
- Circularity with carbon is also important.

Group 2:




- The big focus is still carbon.
- Need to look at carbon alongside financial impacts in the bidding process.
- Can't do everything at once, so the group should focus on carbon initially and consider the other factors later.
