

# Case Study: Viridian Solar

## **Challenges:**



As a manufacturer of environmental products, Viridian Solar believes it is crucial to 'walk the talk.' The company strives to lead by example, ensuring its operations minimise environmental impact.

Viridian Solar recently released

two world-first Environmental Product Declarations (EPD) for solar panels and solar mounting kits. These EPDs detail the environmental performance of their products from a lifecycle perspective, a concept they grasped more thoroughly after completing an e-module provided by the Supply Chain Sustainability School.

In addition to serving UK customers, Viridian Solar ensures efficient deliveries by dispatching full lorries.

Packaging has been a significant focus for Viridian Solar. The company has eradicated plastic packaging from their roofing kit boxes, substituting a plastic foam protection sheet with a paper-based alternative. This change ensures all packaging enters a single recycling waste stream (paper and cardboard), eliminating the need for waste segregation on-site.

Electricity consumption, especially in their office, posed another challenge. To address this, Viridian Solar installed motion sensor lights and solar panels on their building's roof. They also achieved ISO 450001 certification.

Lastly, Viridian Solar launched the Fusion Forest Programme. For every solar panel purchased, the company commits to planting a tree through their forest restoration charity partners. This initiative has been a source of pride for employees, with over 400,000 trees planted to date.
