

Lean and Operational Efficiency Leadership Group Meeting Minutes

12th July 2023

Welcome and introductions

Mark Worrall, CEO of BBI, began the meeting and outlined the agenda. The group would be informed about the planned changes to the Lean group and the goals for 2023/24, discussions around the barriers and opportunities in improving efficiencies, and what actions the Supply Chain Sustainability School and BBI are taking to push Lean and Operational Efficiency to the forefront of the School's content.

Ian Heptonstall, Director of the Supply Chain Sustainability School, gave an overview of the <u>Schools'</u> <u>Website</u>, showing partners the training around Lean and Offsite, in addition to the updated <u>Lean</u> <u>page</u>.

Background/business plan

Mark explained to the partners how the Lean group is being revamped, in part to hit the School's new ambitious targets (50,000 active individuals by 2025). In particular, Lean is being moved away from the concept of tools, towards the principles and values which underpin 'Lean thinking'. In order to impact sustainability, it is essential to embed a Lean approach at earlier stages in the construction process, particularly in the design and procurement stages.

The title of the group has been rebranded to 'Operational Excellence through Lean Thinking', with a focus on the five principles of Lean; Customer Value, Value Stream, Flow, Pull, and Perfection.

The group was asked to share their thoughts on what Lean should focus on. Some of the ideas included:

- The importance of collaborative planning in teams at the earliest stages of the process
- Leadership as a vital starting point to kickstart the process
- Being explicit about who the customer is and tailoring the Lean process to this
- Making people aware that the benefits of Lean are wider than just the monetary value, and extend to wellbeing, recognition, and many more
- Educating people on what waste exactly is; the concept of 'non-value added' practices
- Ensuring that everyone in the team knows the ins and outs of the plan from the start



The challenges of improving operational efficiency in construction

Mark Worrall led this discussion, asking the group about their thoughts on the barriers we face to improve efficiency and how we could best overcome these, helping us to reduce carbon, remove waste, deliver on time, and improve profits.

Some of the ideas from the group on why Lean isn't embedded in organisations included:

- People believing that they're already doing things the right way
- People seeing changing to improve as challenging
- People being hesitant to challenge business standards
- The pressure of running a business as a barrier implementing new processes
- The reactive approach to solve problems has become the norm
- The project-by-project nature of the industry, instead of spending time establishing the team at the outset
- Attitudes are contract focused, not collaborative
- Lack of design cut off
- Lack of ownership over lean within organisations; Who owns it? Who takes responsibility for Lean processes?

What opportunities are there:

- Incentivisation
- Industry standards can be challenged and Value Stream Mapped Early Contractor Involvement (ECI) stage is a big opportunity, BUT procurement route does not encourage ECI being used effectively

Focus for 2023/24

Regarding the learning around Lean and Operational Efficiency, our priorities for this financial year include:

- Increasing the number of people learning about efficiency and productivity
- Engaging 1,400 suppliers by working more closely with our partners
- Improving and updating our learning content
- Making the most of our content by improving marketing and communications around them to reach the most amount of people

Assessing lean maturity

Marc Roberts and Brett Blake have been working with the School team to look at how we best assess Lean practice in organisations. This has led to us developing a new framework in the School that will be freely available to all our Partners and provide a roadmap for improvement and allow organisations to benchmark where they currently are compared to the average in their sector. Again, this assessment will be seeing updates in a move towards the fundamental principles of Lean thinking.
