Performance Update

As part of the School's ambitious target of 50,000 active individuals by 2025, it has set targets for 22,000 active individuals for 2022/23 and 35,000 for 2023/24. The School is also growing its' Partner Relations and Delivery Teams in order to account for this projected growth.

David Emery gave the group an overview of the statistics of the Schools' impact on business performance. The School now has 5,963 active organisations, 23,511 active users, and 205 partners to the end of August 2023.

Wellbeing Group

With recent legislation in Wales, including the Wellbeing of Future Generations Act, and the Social Partnerships and Public Procurement Act, there have been significant steps to boost wellbeing in line with moves towards greater sustainability.

Lyndsey Morrison, Collaboration Manager & Wellbeing Group Lead, attended the meeting to give an overview of the Wellbeing group. Following the publication of the 'Wellbeing in the Built Environment' Report, the group became a fully-fledged Leadership Group. Since January, the group has been opened up to those who aren't just our partners. We now have around 150 people who can attend the meeting.

The School has been working collaboratively with The Lighthouse Club Charity on the Make It Visible Project, a Wellbeing Culture Change Taskforce. #MakeItVisible is a new project which is taskforce driven by CLC and chaired by Bill Hill (Lighthouse) and Sarah Meek (Mates in Mind) that will unite the industry and work collectively to improve the welfare and wellbeing of our built environment workforce for this generation and the next.

4 category groups have been created to provide support to people:

- Reactive Wellbeing (Bill Hill, Lighthouse Club Charity)
- Proactive Wellbeing (Sarah Meek, Mates in Mind)
- Culture Change (Lyndsey Morrison, SCSS)

Social Partnerships and Public Procurement Bill

Sue Hurrell, Head of Fair Work Procurement at Welsh Government, joined the meeting to share information regarding the <u>Social Partnerships and Public Procurement Bill</u>. This the first piece of primary legislation made by Welsh Government on Procurement and it became law recently in May.

The procurement aspect of the act aims to include clauses which embed wellbeing and ensure wellbeing outcomes, make sure they're supplied throughout supply chains, and ensure there's a system in place to monitor that.

The School is keen to understand what partners would like to better understand from the Bill, for example regarding preparation for the procurement guidance. In addition to this, we'd be interested to hear from any partners who could demonstrate how they are aiming to move forward with the guidance, showing a case study of best practice. We aim to develop a number of virtual events on this topic to raise awareness about the legislation to help organisations in Wales prepare for the Bill.

Both the School and Welsh Government would also welcome input from partners about how to promote the Bill and its wellbeing outcomes more widely.

In addition to this, following the previous Leadership Group meeting in which partners gave us ideas of Welsh-specific topics which we could develop events around, we have begun to plan events on the topics of:

- Retrofit
- Carbon reporting
- Net Zero
