

Case Study: RW Joinery (Stockport) Ltd

Challenges:

Sustainability is a priority at RW Joinery, particularly concerning energy and carbon reduction, both for the benefit of the environment and to support clients in achieving their offset goals. The company implemented a carbon reduction policy in 2010, aiming to decrease carbon output by 55% by 2030 and achieve carbon neutrality by 2040.

In the realm of timber and door manufacturing, sustainability practices have advanced over the past two decades. Timber products in door set manufacturing typically incorporate woodbased materials with FSC or PEFC chain of custody certification. FSC members undergo annual audits to ensure compliance with certified product usage, minimizing the use of non-sustainable timbers—an objective RW Joinery strives to achieve.

Challenges arise from the current geopolitical climate. RW Joinery employs a specific high acoustic timber-based door core, sourced from Russia, and manufactured in Poland. Although the product previously held a full FSC certificate, the unavailability of Russian material has led to the adoption of a non-FSC alternative.

This challenge is not confined to Europe. Materials arriving from the Far East are now taking a longer route to Europe around South Africa, bypassing the Suez Canal, and increasing the carbon



footprint. While the product remains sustainable in its forestry element, the environmental impact is notable due to the altered shipping routes.

Impact:

Accessible learning styles – RW Joinery has found that by engaging with the Supply Chain Sustainability School, the company now has access to a plethora of educational tools. These tools enable employees to explore topics of their interest and gain insights into important sustainability issues. The availability of a diverse range of learning tools has proven useful, allowing employees to engage with content in various formats and styles.

Important topics – RW Joinery has particularly enjoyed learning about carbon footprint measurement, carbon reduction, the impact on climate change, and the significance of social value in a company through the engagement with the Supply Chain Sustainability

School. Although the company had already taken steps to increase social value in the local area, the
