2. Business Planning 2025/2026

The purpose of this meeting was to create a business plan for 2025/2026 which reflects the learning priorities of the FM sector.

Mark outlined the results of the 2024 Impact Survey from Partners and members, which are used to inform business planning. Please refer to the slides for further information regarding data collected. Key themes:

- Sustainability was ranked as the highest priority for Partners. The top 5 sustainability challenges were: Carbon, Waste, People/Skills, Reporting, Procurement/Costs
- For the FM sector, the top 3 risks were Carbon, Costs and joint 3rd were Waste / Circular Economy and Materials

The group then went on to discuss 4 questions. **Please see key outputs for each question discussed on the <u>Mural Board here</u>.**

Main Discussion Points:


- Cost is a large obstacle, as there are difficulties between balancing budgets with sustainability goals (including whole life costs) within own businesses and within the supply chain
- Data and Reporting are a major focus and the group would like more online events tailored to this
- Retrofit is becoming increasingly important and was noted by group members as needing to be higher up on the priority areas
- The key sustainability challenges noted by the FM Group were focused on People, Procurement, Data, Retrofit and Technology.

Initial proposed outputs for 2025/2026 include:

- Collaborative delivery of a minimum of 4 webinars, topics include:
 - People: Engaging, developing and Involving People focussing on skills gaps, social value and Fairness, Inclusion and Respect
 - Data: Webinar addressing making productive uses of data and integrating data into decision making
 - Reuse/Sustainable Retrofit: In collaboration with FIS (Finishes and Interiors Sector)
 - Sustainable/circular procurement in practice including practical examples/case studies of whole life costing.

Priority challenges were identified as follows:

- Share Impact Survey results once data have been collected (March 2025)
- Share group suggestions with other relevant School Groups e.g. FIS
- Look at what the School can do in the coming FY to meet the suggestions made by the group and develop a business plan based on this (ongoing).
- Mark to circulate draft Business Plan to FM Leadership Group members for feedback
