### **Presentations on Decarbonising Materials:**

The majority of our meeting was dedicated to discussion and knowledge share on decarbonising materials within the industry.

**Scott Brewster** gave a presentation on Brewster Brothers, who manufacture recycled aggregates from construction waste streams See attached slides for more information.

**David Crawford** gave a presentation on Deeside Timberframe – who produce timber engineering solutions for domestic and commercial markets across the UK. See attached slides for more information.

Both companies would be invited to present their solutions to the School Membership in Scotland as part of the training programme for 24/25. Brewster Brothers also agreed to host a visit to their production facility, if the School could arrange. **ACTION - Loraine** 

#### **Discussion on Decarbonising Materials:**

Splitting into two groups, the Partners discussed the themes and materials which the School would build into training content for our forthcoming Scotland Training sessions including:

- Importance of homegrown timber and other materials to prevent carbon emissions from transport and to boost domestic manufacturing / economy.
- Other materials eg glass, fibreglass, plasterboard, bricks, blocks
- The importance of considering decarbonisation of materials at the design stages, as well as Early Contractor Involvement (ECI) in major +projects.
- Offsite and MMC focus
- Involve clients and designers to increase take-up
- The need to re-educate all in the built environment on the quality equivalence of recycled materials
- Framing the use of materials contracturally eg RICS standards/PAS 2080/BS1798 –
   dovetailing some partners have it written into contracts
- The need to streamline data and enable specification of materials to allow for the flow of new materials
- Innovations hydrogen/green hydrogen
- The importance of standardisation of products across the industry
- The Net Zero Pubic Sector Buildings Standard in Scotland (NZPSB) its use, impact and importance of promoting to upcoming projects.
- Passivhaus and the importance of Life Cycle Analysis / whole life carbon

The School is making excellent progress towards its ambitious target of having 1,000 active members base in Scotland. The baseline for year 24/25 was 750. We now have over 780 members and are building engagement with a regular programme of marketing and event based training. In March 2023 the number of active companies was 499. So if we achieve 1,000 companies by March 2025 the School will have doubled its impact in Scotland within two years.

In terms of Partner priority suppliers based in Scotland, there are now 556 of these key supply chain companies – and the target for end of year is 700. This would mean that 70% of the School's active members in Scotland are important materials suppliers and sub-contractors to the School's Partners.
